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Outcome from Trip

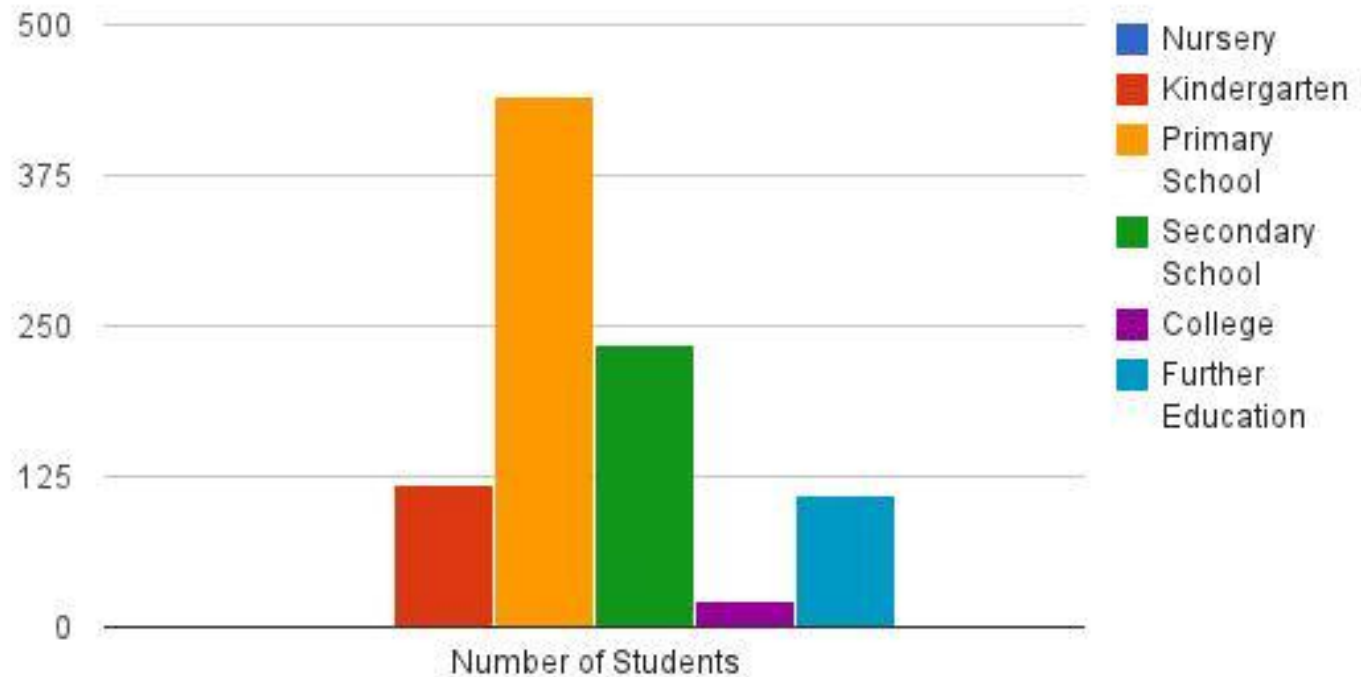

Imam Zamana Mission Student Breakdown



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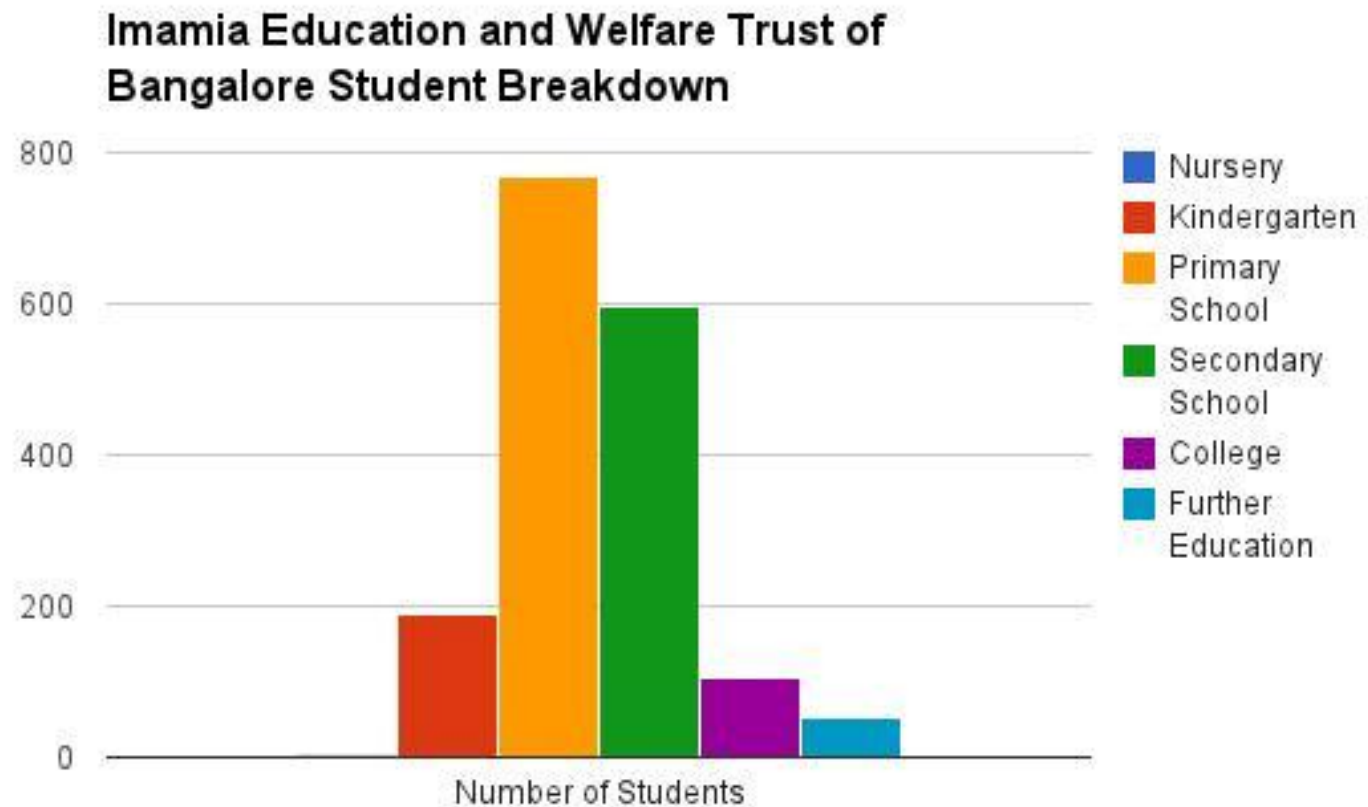
Action points raised with IZM

- Schools structure needs to ensure Principal and teacher recommendations are taken on board
- Student results need to improve in IZM Sajjadiya Schools
- Teacher's need to be qualified and able to teach their subject matter with competence
- Professional counselling needs to be provided in many areas to deal with issues that inhibit educational development
- Student absences are an issue in some schools
- At the IZM Qayamnagar school social struggles of the students are complex and their backgrounds leaves the school with difficult students and their attitudes towards education. Thus at this particular school Counselling and the benefits of an education must be regularly provided to the students, their families, and teachers must be equipped to deal with students from difficult backgrounds.

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Action points raised with IEWT

- It was stressed to the leadership of Imamia Education and Welfare Trust that greater communication including success stories and computerised reports were required from the agency at more regular intervals
- They also needed to look into the provision of Counselling for students with complex social issues
- Gender barriers must be broken to allow access to Further Education
- The success of the Alipur school has yet to be emulated by the other schools run by Imamia
- More youth need to be recruited to the running of this agency, and its schools



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
