much difficulty in getting drinking water. The visit was planned on 12th October, 2008 by arranging transport from Mehfile-Murtaza to witness the ceremony of handing over the tube wells to six houses each measuring around 60 Sq yards. The cost of these wells is donated by the philanthropists of our community in Birmingham U.K. They also visited a Madressa for girls forr 5 years and above. This madressa is run for last 10 years.

TIFFIN PROJECT – UPDATE REPORT-VIII

A survey was conducted of deserving seniors in Kharadar and Soldier Bazaar area by the team of KSI Senior Citizen Forum on Sunday the 5th October, 2008 for providing free meals under the Tiffin Project.

A lady in her late sixties lives lonely in Nayabad. Her husband died about 25 years ago. The one room flat belongs to her brother who has given her for use without rent. However, she has to pay maintenance charge Rs. 200 and Rs. 800 for utility bills. She gets ration worth Rs. 1,000 per month from a charitable trust. She has no source of income.

Another lady (65) in the same building, has a widowed daughter (55) having two

kids (son 13 + daughter 9). She has three sons all married but none supports her. However, a sister in law helps occasionally. She gets free ration worth Rs. 1,000 pm and pays rent and maintenance charges Rs. 600 plus Rs. 1,000 pm for utility bills.

A lady (60) stays alone on second floor of an old building in Kharadar. Her husband died 28 years before. She has only one married daughter who helps her occasionally.

An old man (72) lives on second floor of a building in Soldier Bazaar. He retired from banking job in 1996 and gets pension @ Rs. 6,000 pm. He has one married son who has gone to Dubai in search of job. His wife and kids, live with this old man. He pays Rent Rs. 6,000 pm and Rs. 1,300 pm for utility bills. His married daughter in USA sometime sends financial help.

A widow (67) lives on second floor a Trust building in Soldier Bazaar. Her widowed daughter (40 +) also lives with her. She earns petty amount as unqualified nurse. The old lady has two sons who do not provide any support to her. She receives free ration worth Rs. 800 pm plus Rs. 1,000/= from a Trust. She pays Rs. 1,700 pm for rent and utilities.

The above deserving seniors were taken on the register for supply of daily free meals.

VISIT TO ARTS COUNCIL

The Arts Council of Pakistan arranges cultural and recreation program for its members every month. Mr. Ali Raza T. Lakhani is its member and has made arrangement with Arts Council to give benefit of such programs to members of Senior Citizens Forum. On 17th

October, 2008 a cultural program in Gujrati language was arranged at the Arts Council. The members of SCF were informed of this program through announcement on notice board of Mehfil-e-Murtaza with request to participate in this program. About 30

members showed their willingness to attend the program and hence transport in air conditioned coach was arranged from Mehfil-e-Murtaza to the venue of program.

The seniors were given warm welcome upon their arrival and Mr. Ali Raza T. Lakhani was requested to preside and give away prizes. He was requested to address the gathering in Gujrati language. In his speech Mr. Ali Raza T. Lakhani eulogized the rich literature of Gujrati language. He explained the culture and traditions of Gujrati people of several communities namely Meamons. Khojas, Bohris. Ismailis, Qureshis, Syeds, Parsis

and Hindus. They live in harmony and show respect to each other's beliefs.

T. Lakhani Ali Raza also enlightened the difficulties and problems faced by old age people in Pakistan and lamented that the government nor the NGOs help the seniors to overcome their miseries. He said KHI SCF was set up to provide recreation and outing programs to keep the seniors busy and happy. He also explained working of SCF's projects namely, supply of daily free meals to deserving elders, visiting lonely seniors and setting up Seniors' Day Care Centre. After attending the program the seniors were taken to nearby restaurant to have bar-b-que dinner.
