As part of our monthly gathering, ABSN visited the Kenyatta National Hospital children's cancer ward at the end of October. The hospital is the oldest in Kenya and it is currently the largest referral and teaching hospital in the country.



This visit was also to commemorate Eid e Mubahila. We were joined by a few staff from Aristocrats Kenya and also guests from U.K.

The children suffer from different types of cancers and they are as young as two years old. There were 22 children in the ward some had stayed there for over 6 months and were missing a lot on school.





We had carried with us some Mujtaba magazines, books and colours and crayons. We helped the children in colouring and reading.











The kids had a lot of fun though some of them could not join us as they were so sick they could not leave their beds so we went to them. They really appreciate visitors. We were allowed to give them some fruits and toiletries. They are really well looked after by the staff here and have grown to become a small family. ABSN is very grateful to the hospital management for allowing us to visit this ward.


