

Editor's Note

A concept that emerged during our research, and that has been reflected in this handbook is the internationalization of higher education, a relatively recent phenomenon that is synopsized in the introductory pages. This concept is the very reason why we embarked on this project- to demonstrate to prospective undergraduates that there are possible alternate avenues to a quality higher education without having to apply to favoured university destinations, as some students are intimidated by the financial, social, and religious aspects associated with applying to such universities.

The handbook in its primary pages illustrates the emergence of local institutes in countries that offer foreign degrees through twinning programmes, e-based learning, etc; foreign-based university campuses in other countries; and the international recognition of universities, hitherto unknown by the world at large. The factors that have played a role in all these institutions' recent popularity are also briefly explored.

The findings of our research not only unearthed the unequivocal popularity of recent undergraduate routes, and new university destinations, it also highlighted the skepticisms associated. Nevertheless, in almost every scholarly article that has broached on this topic, we find the conclusion being that new and innovative methods of attaining undergraduate degrees, and new destinations for international students to travel to for achieving undergraduate degrees, is here to stay and will be considered on the same pedestal as conventional routes and destinations in a few years' time.

The successful completion of this project would not have been possible without Mrs. Aliya M Gulamhusein, who has devoted her precious time and unrelenting effort in designing and formatting this book.

To ensure all students, both boys and girls get an equal opportunity to be able to access higher & further education so that they follow some career path, by pursuing either University, college or diploma courses.


AIMS & OBJECTIVES

PURPOSES OF THIS HANDBOOK

In line with its objectives, the EBS has embarked on a mission to identify potential destinations of higher learning, alternative to those that students generally apply to. The need for such a project arose due to:

- 1. The proliferation of destinations for quality higher education other than traditional ones,
- 2. Mushrooming of various twinning options and degree transfer programmes that have globalised education of late,
- 3. Increasing costs of education (tuition and living) in places such as the UK, USA, and Australia,
- 4. Loss of income to the AFED from the discontinuation of using Huqooq funds in financing aspiring Students, compounded by the low rate of repayment by graduated students,
- 5. Inability of the AFED to increase the amount loaned to students in line with the escalating costs.

Therefore, this handbook, in illustrating the various routes to undergraduate degrees, and by providing summarized details on several universities in regions other than UK, USA, Canada, or Australia, is intended to be used by those students seeking for an affordable albeit quality higher education.

FRESHER'S GUIDE TO HIGHER EDUCATION

This section gives a brief synopsis of how to handle and equip oneself when preparing for university education. The information has been retrieved from an excellent guide book called "CoEJ Freshers Guide 2006", prepared by the Education Committee of The Council of European Jamaats. It is a recommended must-read for all undergraduate aspirants. Please contact the EBS office for your free copy (see above for contact details of the EBS).

Top Tips by University Graduates

- Make sure you take advantage of discounts available to you as a student.
- Don't buy all your books new. Talk to students who have already done your options and borrow or buy books from them. Alternatively, several bookshops have second hand departments, have a search through these.
- Make a point to get to know those in the year above you. They are a useful source of advice and information (not to mention previous assignments).
- Visit your personal tutor regularly. You'll build a stronger relationship with them, and you're more likely to get a good reference from them.
- Get involved with a variety of clubs and societies. You'll enjoy your studies and your time at university
 more and you'll leave with a very impressive CV. This is also key to integration as you need to develop
 new friendship.
- Try to become a student representative for your course. This position means that you can instigate changes to the course that are important to you as well as looking good on your CV.
- Make sure to head for the library as soon as you get your reading list or your assignments, as they tend to disappear completely if you leave it for too long.

Money Matters

- You need to realise that although your funds may seem big when you start, once you take out your tuition fees, rent, cost of book and other basic bills you are actually left with very little to live off. So resist temptation right at the start and spend your money prudently.
- Put your financial matters in place. Open a student account. check what services different banks have to offer and don't be fooled by the freebies
- Avoid all types of credit cards and store cards.
- Try to avoid borrowing money or lending money to other students.
- Some universities insist that all debts are cleared before releasing exam results at the end of the year (this even includes library fines). So make sure that you pay as you go to avoid tears on results day!
- Most universities have student advisors or student union welfare officers for help, information and advice on managing your finances.

The Right Study Atmosphere

- Learn to say "No" to distractions (TV, etc.).
- Do not study for more than two hours at a time.
- Prioritise. Stay organized. Get a planner, set study times, and stick to them.
- Study during daylight hours. Natural light is more conducive to learning.
- Study in a positive atmosphere: good lighting and clean work area.
- Have a regular study location that is free of distractions.
- When re-writing your notes, take time to predict possible test questions.
- Use your old exams, quizzes, and handouts for study material.
- Use visual representations or create mnemonics to help you remember information
- Sharpen your listening and note taking skills.
- Utilize academic support services available to you.

Do Not Procrastinate

- Review your goals daily so that you can keep them firmly in your mind.
- Use your timetable and develop the habit of writing activities down.
- Record all deadlines, both short and long term ones, on the timetable.
- Be wary of the tendency to say 'Oh! Forget it. I will do it later.'
- After starting, do not let too many days go by without adding to the progress.
- Divide a subject into parts, and set deadlines for each part.

Adjusting To University - An Islamic Perspective

- Be proud of being Muslim. Don't hide your faith and be embarrassed about it.
- Always stay within the realms of the Sharia and never forget your daily prayers. Try to recite Quran on a regular basis, and make sure you take important literature with you to university such as Peshawar Nights, Nahjul Balagha, and Al-Sahifa Al-Sajjadiyyah.
- Assist the 'borderliners' to discover their faith through discussions, encouraging reading, ibadaat and halal substitutes for entertainment.
- Through your akhlaq and logical reasoning, guide your non-Muslim friends.
- When the opportunities arise, inform your non-Muslim friends about Islam
- There is no point of being proud of Islam if its effects are not perceived in your actions. Muslim pride should be backed up every step of the way by the corresponding actions.

Things to do in Freshers Week

- Enrol for your course, meet lecturers and your personal tutor.
- Enrol at the library and computing centre.
- Get your student union identity card.
- Open a bank account, unless you have one already.
- Buy some books.
- Have a guided tour of the campus.
- Try out for the sports team that interests you.
- Make sure that student fees and accommodation are paid for and student loan comes through.
- Make sure you have enough money to last you the first few days. Remember that your funds may be delayed.

ALTERNATE ROUTES TO HIGHER EDUCATION

INTRODUCTION

The past two decades have witnessed a tremendous upsurge of the volume, scope, and complexity of the international activities of universities in the UK, Australia, New Zealand, USA, and Canada. These range from providing access to higher education in countries where local institutions cannot meet demand, to establishing overseas campuses in foreign countries.

The emergence of alternate destinations to higher education is also evident. Traditional targets such as UK, USA and Canada, initially replaced by countries such as Australia and New Zealand, are now threatened by indigenous universities in South Africa, Japan, China, and other European countries.

Experts in the field of academia have viewed this trend as being inevitable, and in line with the contemporary inclination to globalize.

This trend in globalization of higher education has deeply affected universities in countries favoured by international students. International student numbers in the USA have risen from 34,322 in 1954 to 565,039 in 2006. However, when compared to annual growth rates, this figure should have been much higher. For more than thirty years international student figures have shown a steady and strong growth. In 1999/2000 the growth rate stood at 6.4%. This has now dropped to a bare 1.3%, a far cry from the heydays of previous years.

Similarly, in response to reduced international student numbers at home, British universities are trying to reach more foreign students where they live. The number of foreign students taking British university courses overseas has exploded from almost nothing 15 years ago to well over 100,000 today and is fast approaching the 200,000 mark. The slump in foreign students is affecting the top universities too, as portrayed by a survey of universities in the Russell Group that showed 60% of UK's top universities experienced a decline in overseas students.

Where Are International Students Going?

Student mobility is seen not to be restricted to conventional destinations. Rather, students are increasingly applying to one of the following:

- Institutes that have partnership and credit transfer agreements with universities in the USA, Canada, UK, Australia, and New Zealand- although there exist numerous such institutes, our examination of this option will be restricted to institutes in Malaysia.
- Universities having offshore campuses in other countries- although there are several other options, campuses in Malaysia, South Africa, and Dubai are considered in this handbook.
- Indigenous universities in other countries- Sweden, South Africa, and India will be focused on within this category.
- Online universities that offer degree programmes- this is not explored in this report.

PROS FOR ALTERNATIVE DESTINATIONS

Tuition Fees and Living Costs are Lower at Alternate Destinations

Tuition Fees

Universities in UK, US, and Australia are accused of increasing tuition fees for international students above the rate of inflation. OECD reported that Sweden, which imposes NO tuition fees for foreign and local students has experienced a steady growth in its foreign student population. The tables below suffice to illustrate this point.

Other Costs

Other costs such as student visas are also a factor to consider. For example, some feel that international students could be discouraged to apply for UK universities due to doubling of the price of student visa in 2004.

Language

Previously, the global dominance of the English language gave the UK, the USA, and Australia a real competitive edge. That is now under threat as universities in Europe have started to provide courses for overseas students taught in English, such as Sweden, and institutes in countries such as Malaysia, Dubai, India, and Africa countries use English as the form of communication in their lectures and studies.

Quality of Degree, Teaching Methods, & Examinations

The increasing number of British and Australian academics opting to transfer to foreign countries, such as South Africa and Malaysia, to take advantage of more lucrative working conditions and pay is indicative to high quality standards. Moreover, partners to local institutes oversee quality,

such as the University of London, which ensures that external students within its 130 academic institutions abroad follow the same syllabus as their counterparts in Britain and take the same exams. Foreign universities ensure that their offshore campuses meet and fulfill the academic standards established for completion of a degree qualification.

Hospitable & Welcoming

Post 9/11 has seen countries such as USA, Canada, and Australia becoming inhospitable and wary of foreign students, especially those with Muslim names. This is vast contrast to the Islamic environment and friendliness one encounters within places like Malaysia and Dubai.

CONS FOR ALTERNATIVE DESTINATIONS

Profit Making is the Prime Objective

Start from here- The ultimate intention of globalization of the 'knowledge product', as any international product, is viewed as having profit maximization. British and Australian institutions have been especially active internationally, by setting up foreign campuses and establishing partnership agreements with indigenous institutes, as a way of making up for budget cuts at home.

Absence Of Regulation

Some academics question whether a degree earned overseas is as good as one obtained in UK, USA, or Australia. They cite the lack of external accountability of activities of universities with offshore campuses and those with collaboration agreements.

Islamic Environment

Countries such as Malaysia are not all that different, in terms of Islamic environment, to places such as UK, USA, and Australia. The absence of structured Jamaats in such countries is cited as a disadvantage as well.

CONCLUSION

With the coming of the era of knowledge-based economy, higher education is now playing an unprecedented important role, with internationalization becoming a global trend in the development of higher education. It is conceded by all that no matter which country an institute of higher education is situated in, the higher its academic level, the more foreign scholars and foreign students it will attract.

The rapid growth of internationalization of higher education has caused local institutes and governments to pay more heed to effectively regulating education in their countries. The Malaysian Association of Private Colleges and Universities (MAPCU) is an example of this. Moreover, universities having foreign campuses in other countries are also increasingly putting in place rules and codes that govern imparting of quality education, such as the Australian Vice-Chancellors' Committee's (AVCC) Code of Ethical Practice in the Provision of Education to International Students by Australian Universities.

Foreign students have always generated enormous incomes for countries such as the UK and USA- an estimated contribution of £3bn and \$12bn to the UK and US economies respectively. However, with the increase in tuition and living costs in these countries, coupled with stricter immigration and work permit laws, these countries have steadily become less desirable, resulting in a great loss of income. Education analysts and academics predict an increase in internationalization by universities in these countries and similar ones, through twinning and degree transfer programmes, and establishment of foreign campuses, in order to preserve their share of the foreign student market.

HIGHER EDUCATION IN MALAYSIA

INTRODUCTION TO HIGHER EDUCATION IN MALAYSIA

Malaysia's aspirations to become a regional hub for educational excellence are being realized as evidenced by the rising number of international students that move to its shores in pursuit of higher learning. International students rose from 5,635 in 1996 to about 45,000 in 2005, with plans by the Ministry of Education to increase this number to more than 100,000 foreign students by the year 2010. Most of the factors mentioned on page xxxx, such as low tuition and living costs, quality education, wide use of English, and a friendly and Islamic environment, have contributed to the popularity of Malaysia as a destination for students aspiring for an undergraduate degree. Malaysian educational institutes also lay due emphasis on research and development, a traditional hallmark for gaining international respectability. Several universities in Malaysia have achieved recognition in international exhibitions for new inventions.

DEGREE PROGRAMMES

Universities and Colleges conducting undergraduate degree programmes in Malaysia can be categorized as follows:

- 1. Public Universities offering Malaysian degrees and certificates (not considered in this handbook)
- 2. Private Universities offering a combination of twinning programmes and degree transfer programmes
- 3. Foreign universities with campuses in Malaysia

Twinning Programmes

Private colleges and universities collaborate with foreign universities such as those in the UK, USA, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand and offer their courses on a twinning basis in Malaysia. The student has the choice of completing all academic years in Malaysia or proceeding to the respective foreign university for the penultimate or final year. The course and degree certificate is, however, from the respective foreign university.


The illustration below gives an example of the twinning programme:



Degree Transfer Programmes with USA/Canada, Australia/ New Zealand, UK

This programme offers 1-2 years of degree studies at a College in Malaysia, with credit transfers to USA, Canada, UK, Australian and New Zealand Partner Universities. The programme enables students to acquire a Bachelors' degree with the academic standards, curriculum, syllabus and examinations that correspond with those of the partner universities, without spending the complete duration of the degree in that country. The illustration below gives an example of a degree transfer programme.

Foreign Universities with Campuses in Malaysia

These universities offer full degree programs under the supervision of the parent university abroad, thereby ensuring that academic standards are implemented and achieved. Degree programmes offered in each of these universities are identical to degrees taught at the main campus in their respective country. At the end of their undergraduate education, students are conferred a degree certificate of the respective universities they have studied at.

HIGHER EDUCATION IN SOUTH AFRICA

INTRODUCTION

Since 1994 the South African tertiary education sector has undergone major transformation and restructuring process geared to meet the higher education needs of the 21st century. At the same time, South Africa has become the continental leader in the provision of high quality tertiary education relevant to the demands of a rapidly globalising, competitive, information-driven world.

Increased Numbers of Foreign Students

The number of foreign students in South Africa has soared from 12,600 in 1994 to some 52,000 today, or 7% of a total higher education student population of 730,000 students, according to statistics compiled by the Department of Education of South Africa. Furthermore, the number of South African students studying abroad is reducing each year.

Out of South Africa's 52,703 international students in 2005, over two thirds were from SADC countries, 14% from other African countries, and 15% from the rest of the world.

Improvement in Quality

South Africa has launched major initiatives aimed at improving the quality, relevance and effectiveness of higher education. Quality assurance processes are underway, curricula are being transformed to make higher education more relevant and responsive to regional, national, and multinational needs, student enrolments are being directed towards the skills that economies need, and student admission processes are being streamlined.

A quality assurance system was introduced in 2004, developed and operated by the Higher Education Quality Committee (HEQC) of the Council on Higher Education. Regular audits of universities are conducted, focusing on the needs for teaching and learning.

Strong Research Commitments

South African research is also the strongest on the continent. Thousands of scholars are conducting research that is helping to drive development and to advance the new products and technologies that a competitive economy needs. The national research survey revealed, encouragingly, that South Africa's innovation system has showed real growth of five percent a year from 2001 to 2004, thereby attaining the government's goal of one percent of GDP by 2008.

Admission Requirements

Generally, the following are the required admission qualifications and grades for most of South African universities:

- 18 Points in A'Level
- 28 Points in International Baccalaureate Diploma

However, for a more accurate depiction of academic requirements, prospective students would have to check with the university they are applying to.

HIGHER EDUCATION IN SWEDEN

INTRODUCTION

In recent years, Sweden has proved to be a favoured destination for higher learning for not only Scandinavian and European students, but also for other international students as well. Several factors underlie its popularity:

- No tuition fees for foreign and Swedish students.
- Long and proud history of academic excellence, with outstanding universities dating back to the 15th century.
- Wide range of degree courses offered
- Over the last 4 years foreign student numbers have grown by over 80%.
- Almost all Swedes speak fluent English, making it easier for foreign students to adapt to their new surroundings.
- Knowledge of a second European language (Swedish) may increase the "saleability" of a graduate.

Swedish Higher Education System

A foreign student, with no knowledge of Swedish, intending to apply to Sweden has three options:

- o Study for Swedish separately and than apply to Swedish universities for any course, subject to passing the TSIUS Swedish test.
- o Apply to any of the five universities offering undergraduate programmes taught in English.
- o Apply only to those universities that will first teach you Swedish first.

For the purposes of this handbook only the last two options is considered

Minimum Admission Requirements

Generally, the minimum requirements for admission is as follows:

- Completion of an upper-secondary school programme, such as A'Levels.
- Proficiency in English (both written and oral). Universities and university colleges will normally require verification in the form of an international proficiency test certificate, such as TOEFL.
- Written and oral skills in Swedish, generally assessed by the national Swedish test, TISUS.

However, entrance requirements for particular courses or programmes are established independently at each academic institution and students will need to contact the university for more exact information.

UNIVERSITIES OFFERING UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES IN ENGLISH

Under this section, only three universities are considered. However there are a few more that offer undergraduate degree programmes in English.

1. J NK PING INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS SCHOOL (JIBS)

The University At A Glance

In recent years, JIBS has expanded its courses, undergraduate and graduate programmes and research. Due to the fact that JIBS is part of a foundation and not state owned, it has been able to employ highly qualified professors making it very competitive among business schools in the Nordic countries. Engineering Twinning Programmes

Under this programme, students pursue the first two years of an undergraduate course in engineering at Manipal and the last two years in a foreign university in USA, U.K., or Australia. The foreign university awards the degree.

Medical Twinning Programmes

The programme is structured as follows: 4 years at The Kasturba Medical College International Center, 6 months at the American University of Antigua (AUA) College of Medicine, and 6 months in clinical rotations at various teaching hospitals in the USA.

MINIMUM ADMISSION CRITERIA

In the qualifying examinations, such as A Levels or IB, a minimum of a C average is essential for the following:

- For laboratory-related courses- in physics, chemistry, and biology
- For engineering courses- in Physics, Mathematics with Chemistry or Biotechnology or Computer Science or Biology
- For all other courses- in the subjects taken in the qualifying examinations.
